Sewer Inspection Fee- \$32.00 (Replacement Line Only. Inspection of new hookup included in tap fee.)

Unmetered condensation from commercial HVAC units which flow into the sanitary sewer will be billed at the commercial sewer rate. The monthly charge is determined using an average number of gallons as calculated by an architect and submitted to Water Quality Control for review.

Re-inspections \$58/hour

Note:

Re- inspections for backflow meters and grease traps are required when a device fails its routine annual test and inspection. In addition to the annual fee, a charge of \$58 per hour, with a minimum of one (1) hour charged per inspection, shall be assessed for each follow-up visit. No charge will be assessed for additional inspections made at the discretion of the City's Inspector.

Industrial Pretreatment Discharge

\$3.51 per 100 gallons of average daily process discharge with a minimum fee of \$160

Septage Waste

Septage Waste Haulers Annual Permit Fee - \$129/truck

Septage Waste delivered to Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant- \$46.00 per thousand gallons

Sale of Biosolids (Subject to Availability)

Composted biosolids Class A EQ for use by the general public, charges as shown below:

Small dump truck- \$224 per load delivered in Blount County (\$122 if customer hauls)

Large dump truck- \$306 per load delivered in Blount County (\$179 if customer hauls)

Pickup truck load- \$26 per truck (customer haul only)

For haul vehicles other than those listed above, material shall be billed based on the measured cubic yards of the space to be filled with composted biosolids at a rate of \$13 per cubic yard.

Upon recommendation of the Director of Public Utilities, the City may temporarily suspend the Sale of Biosolids as shown above and distribute such materials free of charge from the site of the Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant. In this circumstance, the Director of Public Utilities will provide the public with advance notice of the event by means that may include a notice in the local paper or posting on the City's website. The city will not deliver biosolid materials in the event of a free distribution. Moreover, biosolids distributed without charge are intended for the private use of individuals and not for resale.
