The Vice-Mayor declared a quorum to be present.

Thereupon, the Vice-Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:53 p.m. regarding an ordinance to abandon a portion of an alley located between Columbus Street and Front Street identified as Alley #328A. There were no further comments, the Vice-Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, the Vice-Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:54 p.m. regarding an ordinance to abandon a portion of an alley located between Columbus Street and Front Street identified as Alley #328B.
