PUBLIC HEARING AND REGULAR MEETING

The City Council of the City of Maryville met for a Public Hearing on April 4, 2017 at the Maryville Municipal Center at 6:57 p.m. when the following members were present: Mayor Tom Taylor presiding, Councilmen Tommy Hunt, Fred Metz, Joe Swann, and Andy White. Also present were City Manager Greg McClain, City Recorder Deborah P. Caughron, and City Attorney Melanie Davis. The Mayor declared a quorum to be present.

Thereupon, the Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:57 p.m. in regard to amending the City of Maryville's Zoning Map at 810 Montvale and at 420 Indiana from College Hill Historic District to a combination of Neighborhood and Residential. There were no further comments so the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, the Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:58 p.m. regarding the abandonment of an undeveloped ten foot wide alley that runs parallel with Griffin Avenue identified as Alley 88B on the attached map. There were no further comments so the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, the Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:59 p.m. regarding the abandonment of a portion of a thirty (30) foot wide alley which connects S. Maple Street with S. Ruth Street and is identified as Alley #293 on the attached site map. There were no further comments so the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Lauren Kardatzke for a term to expire July 2018

Steve Greene for a term to expire July 2020

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilman Metz and seconded by Councilman Swann to consider a motion declare certain items as surplus and to authorize their disposal. On roll call the vote was unanimous.

Thereupon, there being no further business, the Mayor adjourned the meeting until the next scheduled meeting unless sooner called by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by law.
