PUBLIC HEARING AND REGULAR MEETING

The Maryville City Council convened for a public hearing and regular business meeting on August 3, 2021 at 6:59 p.m. when the following members were present and answered roll call: Mayor Andy White presiding, Councilmembers Sarah Herron, Fred Metz and Drew Miles. Also present were City Manager Greg McClain, City Recorder Sherri Phillips, and City Attorney Melanie Davis. Councilman Tommy Hunt was absent. The Mayor declared a quorum to be present.

Thereupon, the Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:59 p.m. regarding an ordinance to abandon a portion of an alley located between Boardman Avenue and Barnes Avenue designated as Alley #238. There were no further comments, the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, Council convened for regular business at 7:00 p.m. when the following members were present and answered roll call: Mayor Andy White presiding, Councilmembers Sarah Herron, Fred Metz and Drew Miles. Also present were City Manager Greg McClain, City Recorder Sherri Phillips, and City Attorney Melanie Davis. Councilman Tommy Hunt was absent. The Mayor declared a quorum to be present.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Herron and seconded by Councilmember Miles to approve the minutes from the June 17, 2021 Called Council Meeting and July 6, 2021 Council Meeting. On roll call the vote was unanimous.

Thereupon, the following captioned ordinance was presented, considered, and placed for passage on second reading:

AN ORDINANCE TO ABANDON A PORTION OF AN ALLEY LOCATED BETWEEN SPRINGDALE STREET AND PINEDALE STREET AND DESIGNATED AS ALLEY #475.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Miles and seconded by Councilmember Herron that said ordinance be passed on second reading. On roll call the vote was unanimous. The Mayor declared that said ordinance had been adopted. The ordinance was signed by the Mayor and City

Recorder. The Mayor ordered said ordinance numbered 2021-33 and recorded in the Ordinance Book of the City.

Thereupon, the following captioned ordinance was presented, considered, and placed for passage on second reading:

AN ORDINANCE TO ABANDON ALLEYS LOCATED OFF OF S. EVERETT HIGH ROAD DESIGNATED AS ALLEYS #245 AND #246.

The Mayor declared that said ordinance had been adopted as amended. The ordinance was signed by the Mayor and City Recorder. The Mayor ordered said ordinance numbered 2021-36 and recorded in the Ordinance Book of the City.

Thereupon, the following captioned ordinance was presented, considered, and placed for passage on first reading:

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Miles and seconded by Councilmember Metz that said ordinance be passed on first reading. On roll call the vote was unanimous. Thereupon, the Mayor declared that said ordinance had passed on first reading.

Thereupon, the following captioned ordinance was presented, considered, and placed for passage on first reading:

AN ORDINANCE TO ABANDON A PORTION OF AN ALLEY LOCATED BETWEEN BOARDMAN AVENUE AND BARNES AVENUE AND DESIGNATED AS ALLEY #238.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Miles and seconded by Councilmember Metz that said ordinance be passed on first reading. On roll call the vote was unanimous. Thereupon, the Mayor declared that said ordinance had passed on first reading.

Thereupon, the following resolution was presented, considered, and placed for adoption:

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SPECIAL EVENT "TASTE OF BLOUNT" TO BE HELD FROM 6PM- 8PM, SEPTEMBER 9, 2021.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Metz and seconded by Councilmember Miles that said resolution be adopted. On roll call the vote was unanimous. The Mayor declared that said resolution had been adopted. The resolution was signed by the Mayor and City Recorder. The Mayor ordered said resolution numbered 2021-12 and recorded in the Resolution Book of the City.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Metz and seconded by Councilmember Miles to consider a motion to authorize the city to enter into a contract for the regional wastewater treatment plant project with the low bidder, W&O Construction Company, Inc. Upon roll call the vote was unanimous.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilman Miles and seconded by Councilman Metz to approve a City Council appointment of Susan Williams to the Blount County Library Board for a term to expire July 2024. On roll call the vote was unanimous.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilman Metz and seconded by Councilman Herron to approve a City Council appointment of Suzette Donovan to the Ocoee Regional Library Board for terms to expire August 2024. On roll call the vote was unanimous.

Thereupon, there being no further business, the Mayor adjourned the meeting until the next scheduled meeting unless sooner called by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by law.
