The Maryville City Council convened for a public hearing and regular business meeting on November 2, 2021 at 6:56 p.m. at the Maryville Municipal Center when the following members were present: Vice-Mayor Fred Metz presiding, Councilmembers Sarah Herron, Tommy Hunt and Drew Miles. Also present were City Manager Greg McClain, City Recorder Sherri Phillips, and City Attorney Melanie Davis. Mayor Andy White was absent. The Vice-Mayor declared a quorum to be present.

Thereupon, the Vice-Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:56 p.m. regarding a resolution of the City of Maryville, Tennessee to annex property located on Proffitt Springs Road being Blount County Tax Map 035 Parcels 041.00 and 41.05 to incorporate the same within the corporate boundaries of the City of Maryville, Tennessee. At this time, City and county residents addressed Council regarding the annexation of property located on Proffitt Springs Road. There being no further comments, the Vice-Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, the Vice-Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:57 p.m. regarding the plan of services for the proposed annexation of property located on Proffitt Springs Road being Blount County Tax Map 035 Parcels 041.00 and 41.05. There being no further comments, the Vice-Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, the Vice-Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:58 p.m. regarding an ordinance to amend the Future Land Use Map of the City of Maryville, Tennessee by designating property being Blount County Tax Map 035 Parcels 041.00 and 41.05 as Industrial. There being no further comments, the Vice-Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, the Vice-Mayor declared the Council in session for a Public Hearing at 6:59 p.m. regarding an ordinance to amend the Zoning Map of the City of Maryville, Tennessee by zoning property being Blount County Tax Map 035 Parcels 041.00 and 41.05 as Industrial. There being no further comments, the Vice-Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Thereupon, the Maryville City Council convened for a regular business meeting on November 2, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. at the Maryville Municipal Center when the following members were present and answered roll call: Vice-Mayor Fred Metz presiding, Councilmembers Sarah

Herron, Tommy Hunt and Drew Miles. Also present were City Manager Greg McClain, City Recorder Sherri Phillips, and City Attorney Melanie Davis. Mayor Andy White was absent. The Vice-Mayor declared a quorum to be present.

At this time, Boy Scout Troop 87 presented the colors and lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Hunt and seconded by Councilmember Herron to approve the minutes from the October 5, 2021 Council Meeting. On roll call the vote was unanimous.

At this time, Mark Pulliam, 1909 S. Whitehall Street, Maryville, Tennessee, addressed Council in opposition to the proposed Cross Creek development.

A RESOLUTION TO ANNEX PROPERTY LOCATED ON PROFFITT SPRINGS ROAD BEING BLOUNT COUNTY TAX MAP 035 PARCELS 041.00 AND 041.05 TO INCORPORATE THE SAME WITHIN THE CORPORATE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF MARYVILLE, TENNESSEE.

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Hunt and seconded by Councilmember Miles that said ordinance be passed on first reading. On roll call the vote was unanimous. Thereupon, the Vice-Mayor declared that said ordinance had passed on first reading.

Thereupon, the following captioned ordinance was presented, considered, and placed for passage on first reading:

Thereupon, it was moved by Councilmember Hunt and seconded by Councilmember Herron to consider a motion to approve the appointment of Vice-Mayor Fred Metz to the PC1101 Urban Growth Boundary Coordinating Committee. On roll call the vote was unanimous.

Thereupon, there being no further business, the Vice-Mayor adjourned the meeting until the next scheduled meeting unless sooner called by the Mayor or as otherwise provided by law.
